

Meeting the greatest needs as they arise

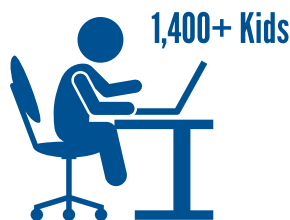
